

## Science & Society Photography Contest

The first annual Duke Science & Society Photography Contest is an opportunity for the Duke community to display images as they see science and human endeavors intersect with ethical, legal, and social implications of science.

### **Eligibility:**

The competition is open to the Duke community, including all faculty, staff, students, post-docs, and alumni.

### **Deadline:**

The deadline for submitting your photograph(s) or your computer-generated image(s) is May 8, 2015.

### **Image Criteria:**

We encourage creativity in both images and titles. Images may portray people using technology; capture the beauty in science; or showcase how science is integrated in law, policy, medicine, genetics, neuroscience, education, and/or scholarship. See the next page for examples of images.

### **Image Submissions:**

You may submit 1-2 images, and all images must be in JPG format. Each submission should include a written statement describing what the image is, how the image was created, and how the image relates to the intersection of science and society. All images must be submitted by the photographer/creator. Please upload to Box (1) your image(s) in the highest resolution of the original image and (2) your written statement, and share the folder with Colleen Higgins, [colleen.higgins@duke.edu](mailto:colleen.higgins@duke.edu).

### **Awards:**

The ten best images will be both displayed on the Science & Society website and exhibited in Science & Society offices in the North Building. The artists of the winning images may choose to provide an 11"x14" print of their work. Otherwise, Science & Society will print the images. First, second, and third place winners will also receive prizes of \$200, \$100, and \$50 respectively.

### **Intellectual Property Rights**

Each entrant shall retain ownership of all intellectual property rights in the entry. However, by entering the contest, entrants grant to Duke Science & Society and Duke University a non-exclusive, perpetual, worldwide, royalty-free license to exhibit the images on Science & Society's website and in its offices; to use the images in its program marketing materials; and to modify the images, but only to the extent required to fit the format for web pages and marketing materials. Duke Science & Society will not commercially exploit the images, and all commercial rights remain with entrants.

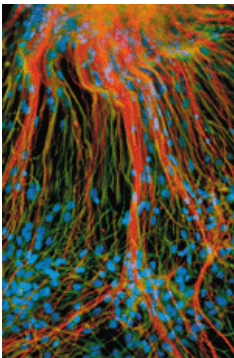

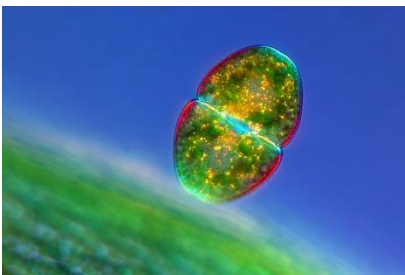
